Would you like to make your future better than your past? Seeking Safety is a treatment program for women who have experienced trauma, addiction, gender-based violence and/or mental health



challenges. It teaches good coping skills to help people to move beyond trauma and addiction. The core goal is to gain safety in your life and to learn to manage addictive behaviours, emotions, impulses and past traumas. It is a free program and can be done in a group or one-to-one setting and is being delivered in various locations around the county including Castlerea, Ballaghaderreen and Monksland. The national Seeking Safety pilot project is supported by the Department of Health through its Women's Health Fund and is being run in partnership with six other community projects around the country.
