Roscommon Women's Network (RWN) are honoured and delighted to be one of fourteen organisations to have been recently awarded a Community Services Programme (CSP) contract by the Department of Rural and Community Development for their CycleUp Social Enterprise.

This funding will enable RWN to recruit a full-time manager and two full-time operational staff to

grow and develop their Circular Economy Social Enterprise.

The group are very thankful to every individual and organisation, locally, regionally and nationally who supported them on this journey over the last four years. The CSP aims to provide employment opportunities and local services to disadvantaged communities.

Minister for Community Development, Integration and Charities Joe O'Brien, TD for Dublin Fingal, announced the awarding of contracts to fourteen new entrants to the Community Services Programme (CSP) following an open call for applications in March of this year.

The minister said, "I am delighted to say that the additional funding of €1 million made available for this new open call for applications under the CSP during 2023, will allow for these additional 14 community-based organisations to be supported under the programme".
